## UPDATE ON CARILEE COLEMAN PARK WITH HISTORIC ROUNTREE LOG CABIN



Though the process is a slow one, we are still working to revitalize the park and cabin that is located at the junction of highway 192 and highway 80. It is a site that will offer residents and visitors the opportunity to enjoy a space in Twin City that offers passive recreation and gathering spaces in an outdoor setting. Our primary objective is to create open spaces (by removing trees and vegetation) and establishing turf; install a simple trail system around and through the site; create parking areas that are visible from the roadway; and


allow for visual access to the historic site and cabin from highway 80.
